**Pastoral/Spiritual Care** is available to all who enter an Eastern Health facility. To avail of this ministry of the church, upon admission, you (or your next of kin) will be asked if you would like to receive pastoral care. If you answer 'yes' and state your denomination you will be added to the list of patients to be visited by the chaplain and/or pastoral visitor. If you answer 'no' your choice will be respected and you will not receive a pastoral visit. Should you later change your mind please advise the nurse or the Pastoral Care office at 777-6959. Chaplains are bound by the Protection of Information Act. Chaplains can only advise your parish clergy of your admission with your consent.

## Faith in the Public Square

**Faith in the Public Square** is a conference to be hosted by the Anglican Diocese of Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador on Saturday, June 3, 2017. This conference will look at the contribution of faith communities to the wider social fabric of our province. **Bishop Peddle** will be chairing the gathering and giving a short opening talk. Speakers will include **Sister Elizabeth Davis**, member of the Sisters of Mercy, CEO of Eastern Health, and recipient of the Order of Canada, and the **Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson**, the 26th Governor General of Canada. With invitations extended to members of **Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Sikh and Buddhist** communities along with other community partners and representatives of municipal, provincial and federal levels of government, the conference will explore the place of faith in Newfoundland and Labrador and examine the ways in which faith is expressed outside the places of worship.
