Help Keep our Cemetery Safe and Beautiful

Flowers are very important in our cemetery and by following a few guidelines the beauty could be maintained forever and our maintenance time and cost could be kept to a minimum:

- Flowers are objects that interfere with grass cutting and general maintenance and should be removed within a two-week period after time of placement.
- All flowers should be placed in safe, unbreakable containers. We have experienced injuries in the past as the lawn mower has passed over pieces of broken glass and pieces of broken wire from singly placed artificial flowers.
- All unsightly flowers and objects that interfere with maintenance <u>will be</u> <u>removed</u> by the committee after the time period has elapsed.
- When placing flowers, it is preferred that they be placed on headstones in special holders or as close to the base as possible.

St. Peter's History Did you know?

On Tuesday, November 16, 1909, St. Peter's Church was consecrated by the Right Reverend Llewellyn Jones, Bishop of Newfoundland (1840-1918). This was a day of great pride and celebration for members of the congregation, who had been working since July 1905 to make their new place of worship a reality. The consecration ceremony was also an important social event. The sanctuary, decorated with flowers by women from the congregation, was filled with people from surrounding communities and other visitors. As reported in the *Diocesan Magazine*:

"For hours before the ceremony people from Seal Cove, Indian Pond, Hopewell, Upper Gullies, Kelligrews, Foxtrap and Long Pond wended {sic} their way to the new church. Visitors and clergy from St. John's, Conception Bay and Trinity Bay came by train and carriage, and when all had assembled, the building was thronged to the doors and outside."

Even the Chief Justice of the Newfoundland Supreme Court and his wife, Sir William and Lady Horwood, attended the ceremony and stayed to enjoy the celebration luncheon held afterwards at St. Peter's School.
