# St. Peter's History Did you know? The 1960's—A Period of Rapid Growth

The 1960's marked a period of growth that would start talks of dividing the Parish of Foxtrap. In 1960, the **Reverend Everett Hobbs** was appointed as an assistant to the **Reverend Mark Genge**, and a parish council was formed. In 1962 a furnace was installed in St. Pater's Church at a cost of \$2,800. In 1961 the church received a set of wrought iron church yard gates, a gift from Jessie Coates, an Upper Gullies native who had trained as a nurse and settled in Boston. In 1963, the Kelligrews rectory was built. The Reverend Mark Genge was succeeded by the **Reverend David Genge** (his brother) in 1965, and during the subsequent five year period the parish contributed \$24,000 towards the construction of Queen's College. In 1968, under the direction of the **Reverend Benjamin Burry**, a Parish Visitation Committee was formed. It's 35 members would visit the sick, the aged, and patients in welfare community care homes, and at monthly meetings would discuss ways of extending pastoral care to the suffering. In October 1968 the new cemetery ground at St. Peter's was consecrated by Bishop Seaborn, and a committee was formed to consider plans for a perpetual care fund.

By the time the Reverend David Genge was succeeded by **Reverend Emmanuel Willis** in 1970, it was widely acknowledged that the parish was becoming too large for one administration. The new parish of Upper Gullies was formed in 1976 and the **Reverend F. R. Rowsell** was appointed its first rector. The new parish included the communities of Upper Kelligrews, Upper and Lower Gullies, Seal Cove and Holyrood. In the year of its formation a new rectory was completed at Upper Gullies on the Cameron Estate, a property bequeathed to St. Peter's Church by Jessie Cameron.
