Stir Up Your People

Stir up your people, God, we pray
and fill us with your grace today
that we may be a helping hand
in spreading peace throughout the land.

Stir up our minds that we may know
in troubled times the way to go,
to listen to the cries of need
which come from selfishness and greed.

Stir up our hearts that we may feel
compassion with a gift to heal,
to be the love that Jesus shared
with those the people often feared.

Stir up our prejudice and pride,
the fear that we would like to hide,
and open wide the doors we shut
that from our plans all doubt is cut.

Stir up our faith and make us strong
to counter all that leads us wrong
and for the people that we meet
to be the Christ, his hands and feet.

Stir-up Sunday is an informal term in Anglican churches for the "Sunday next before Advent" (BCP p259). It gets its name from the beginning of the collect for that day in the Book of Common Prayer which begins with the words, "**Stir up**, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people". In the Revised Common Lectionary that we now follow this collect in contemporary language is suggested for the Sunday that falls between September 4th and 10th.

October 15: Baptism Sunday. This is our Sunday for Baptism this month. Anyone with a child to be baptized should call the church office as soon as possible. This is also the 125th Anniversary of the CLB in this province and the Anniversary Parade at the Cathedral at 3pm.
