All Saints – Next Sunday, October 29th

Each year on November 1st the Anglican Church celebrates All Saints' Day. Although St. Paul in his letters referred to all members of the church as "saints," from early days the word "saint" came to be applied primarily to persons of special sanctity. Thus on All Saints' Day the Church remembered the people like St. Peter and St. Mark. Then on November 2nd the Church observed All Souls' Day in commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. All Saints' Day is also called "All Hallows' Day." (Think of "Hallowed be thy name" in the Lord's prayer where "hallowed" means "blessed," "holy" or "sacred.") On All Saints' Day we remember the "blessed ones" including our loved ones who have died. Hallowe'en which we customarily celebrate with ghosts, witches and trick or treats was originally a religious celebration that was held on the night before All Saints' Day, All Hallows' Eve which became shortened to Hallowe'en. **Because November 1st is a Wednesday this year, we will be celebrating All Saint's Day next Sunday, October 29th.**

CLB Enrollment and Remembrance Day Liturgy – November 5th

On Sunday November 5th at our 10:30 service we will be having our annual CLB Enrollment Ceremony and a short Remembrance Liturgy. From the last Friday in October to Remembrance Day the Canadian Legion invites everyone to wear a poppy as a visual pledge to never forget those who sacrificed for our freedom. We will have a supply of poppies for the children so that they can place them in a special wreath in our Remembrance Liturgy before they go to Godly Play and Confirmation Class.

Fall Family Event – November 5th

The Youth and Family Ministry Committee is organizing a special Fall Family Event for Sunday November 5th. It begins in the church hall right after the service with a light lunch for everyone to be followed by games for the young people.
