Thomas Merton (1915 – 1968) was an American Roman Catholic writer, theologian and mystic. He was a Trappist monk of the Abbey of Gethsemani, Kentucky, and was ordained to the priesthood in 1949. He wrote many books about spirituality, social justice and pacifism. His bestselling autobiography *The Seven Storey Mountain* influenced many people and was listed among the 100 best non-fiction books of the 20th century. He was a proponent of interfaith dialogue and a strong supporter of the non-violent civil rights movement in the US. His books have been read by clergy and lay people of many denominations as a source of inspiration and spiritual guidance.
