Pastoral Message

On the Labrador Coast, when I was a child, CFCY Charlottetown was one of the few radio stations that provided good reception for us. Each Sunday morning we tuned in to listen to "Sunday School by Post and Radio." This was a program sponsored by St. Paul's Anglican Church in Charlottetown, PE.

Details about what Rev. Hogg talked about have faded from my memory, but I remember receiving in the mail four or five weekly magazines rolled together with my name on the outside. Each magazine had some simple Bible lessons and a page with questions. There was space for me to write my answers which I would mail back. A few weeks later I would receive a note from Rev. Hogg with some encouraging comments about what I wrote. I don't know how long I was receiving this literature, but a picture of the booklets and the page with the questions is clear in my mind. It is a warm memory that I cherish and is, no doubt, an important step from the 1950's in the long ladder of my faith development.

Today's collect and Psalm 78 remind me of the importance of knowing the stories of our faith tradition. The theme song for Sunday School by Post and Radio was "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus." I can still hear the lively music and the voices coming through loud and clear on the radio. I have always appreciated knowing that hymn and I hope that you will enjoy singing it today and be inspired as I was by its simple message. **"That which we have heard and known, and what our forefathers have told us, we will not hide from their children."** (Psalm 78:4)
