Pastoral Message

The **JOY** of Advent is a by-product of living with hope. No matter how dark today, we are not in complete darkness. This is the core meaning of our faith in God for whom **"darkness is not dark"** (Psalm 139:12).

Scrooge did not like to hear people laugh or sing. He was so unhappy that any sign of joy made him feel even more despondent. He loved his money, but the more he had the worse he felt.

We all have a little Scrooge inside us. I sometimes refer to my Scrooge as an "imp on my shoulder." He says "Humbug" in many different ways. He hangs around like a wet mitt casting doubt my best intentions.

The Spirit of Christmas is a miracle. Scrooge, however, could not resist the Spirit of Christmas. People who resent doing things for others the rest of the year are suddenly acting "out of character." Penny pinchers spend more than they intended. People who complain about wasting electricity put up extra lights. Even people who hate winter want a little snow.

As we light the Candle of Joy today let us pray that the Spirit of Christmas will work many miracles this year. We pray for miracles in the hearts of terrorists, in the souls of teenagers who feel so bad they want to commit suicide, and in people who use drugs or alcohol in an attempt to ward off the Scrooge making them feel hopeless. We pray that the cold mangers of depressed souls will be warmed with the Body of Christ. We pray for hope, peace, joy and love.
