Christmas Message

"She gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands **of cloth,** and laid him in a manger." (*Luke 2:7*) That was 2000 years ago — a birth that changed the world. It's a birth that is eulogized in scripture, art, poetry, song and theology. And we are in church tonight because of that birth.

Jesus' crib was the feeding bin of animals, but he had the most important thing that any child needs. Mary may have been only 14 or 15, but she believed her child was the most important person in the world. Joseph may not have been his real father, but he risked his life to protect Jesus from the cruel hatred of Herod. Surely, this helped Jesus learn how to turn the other cheek and reach out with respect and love to people his culture often despised.

"There was no place for them in the inn." There's not much room for many children born tonight in refugee camps and homes threatened by terrorism. Many of them will not live to grow up. But some will experience sparks of kindness in the rubble and turmoil of their lives and become advocates for peace and justice.

Sometimes you may feel as if *there is no place* for you where you work or even among the people you call your family. As you reflect on the meaning of Christmas, may you feel encouraged by the love and grace of God that is at the heart of Christmas. God doesn't promise any of us a life without disappointments and loss. But God does promise to be a light in the darkness, a spring in the desert and a companion who walks with us in difficult times.

This is faith. This is what Jesus came to offer people. This is what the church has to offer you today. This is God's gift to you. Accept it. Nurture it. And like Jesus, may you find in it the strength and courage you need to be a loving and giving person. **Merry Christmas.**

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Reader 1: During each Sunday of Advent we light a new candle on the Advent Wreath. Each candle represents a special signpost on the highway that God calls

us to walk through life. All four candles are lit this evening and the banners are hung above the altar. They are the signs of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

Reade 2: Once upon a time the angel Gabriel visited a young woman named Mary. He told her that she was going to have a baby who would be called the Son of God.

Reader 1: Mary wondered what this would mean, but she decided to answer, "Yes!" She said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Reader 2: Today we celebrate the birthday of Mary's baby and listen again to the Christmas story. We give thanks for every child among us. Each new birth reminds us of the wonder of life and the promise of God.

Reader 1: We recall that when Jesus was a baby, the Holy Family became refugees in Egypt because they were not safe in their own country. Many children today are refugees and others do not feel safe in their own homes.

Reade2r: Let us begin our Christmas Celebration by lighting the white candle in the centre of the Advent Wreath for Jesus' birthday and for all children who do not feel safe in their homes tonight. As we light this candle we sing "Jesus Bids Us Shine." (The candle is lit.)

Jesus bids us shine for a world of peace, So that all the fighting and the wars shall cease; All the world needs Jesus, so we must shine, You in your small corner and I in mine.

Jesus bids us shine for a world of joy, And he needs as helpers every girl and boy; All the world needs Jesus, so we must shine, You in your small corner and I in mine.

Jesus bids us shine for the world to see, Like a Christmas candle on a Christmas tree; All the world needs Jesus, so we must shine, You in your small corner and I in mine.

The story continues... (This is followed by the children bringing forward the camels and the three kings as the congregation sings.)

We three kings of Orient are; Bearing gifts we traverse afar, Field and fountain, moor and mountain, Following yonder star.

The story continues... (This is followed by the remaining children coming forward carrying stars as the congregation sings.)
