Introducing Dr. Carmel Doyle, our guest speaker at the Patronal Festival Service next Sunday: Carmel is a graduate of Memorial University, the University of Toronto (Toronto School of Theology), and St. Stephen's College in Edmonton. She has been at Queen's College as an Adjunct Professor for over 25 years in various capacities including chaplaincy, spiritual direction and teaching in the areas of Christian Education, Spirituality, and Supervised Pastoral Ministry.
