Today's Short Message

Today's reading from Isaiah and Psalm 72 inspired Matthew's story of the Wisemen. We do not know if there were any actual "Wisemen," but we do know that Israel was very much influenced by the surrounding nations that were sometimes friends and sometimes enemies. In telling his story Matthew not only linked Jesus to Old Testament prophecies, but he also challenged the church to expand its understanding of God.

As Christian we discover God in the pages of the Bible. But God is not limited by our traditions. God is a living, active reality who is forever challenging us to shine like stars bringing hope and meaning to others. Like the **"wise men"** we must continue to ask questions and seek new answers that will help us live today.

In her Christmas 2000 Broadcast the Queen spoke personally of her own Christian faith. Many people were impressed by that. But even more important was the open attitude she demonstrated towards other religious faiths:

Whether we believe in God or not, I think most of us have a sense of the spiritual, that recognition of a deeper meaning and purpose in our lives, and I believe that this sense flourishes despite the pressures of our world.

This spirituality can be seen in the teachings of other great faiths. Of course religion can be divisive, but the Bible, the Koran and the sacred texts of the Jews and Hindus, Buddhists and Sikhs, are all sources of divine inspiration and practical guidance passed down through the generations.

Her words may be more important and prophetic than many people realize. Unfortunately, large segments of the church would not agree with her candour and openness. But it is the religious sentiment of many Christians, today, and it is a springboard that can make the 21st century an age of change and progress in religious ideas and relations.

Holy Baptism The next date for Baptism is January 14th. It has been the practice at St. Peter's to have a Baptism Service on the third Sunday of each month when there are children to be baptized.
