# Today's Short Message

Earth's crammed with heaven, And every common bush afire with God; But only he who sees takes off his shoes; The rest sit round and pluck blackberries.

"The rest sit round and pluck blackberries." I can understand how they feel. Sometimes life is like that, a monotonous routine of the same old thing.

I thank God for poets like Elizabeth Barrett Browning who are able to see the touches of beauty reflected in common things. Even plucking blackberries can be a pleasant thing to do when you can appreciate the smells, sounds and sights around you. In today's gospel reading, the future was dark for Jesus, but in the darkness he could see a light. His soul was "troubled," but he was able to say, **"Father, glorify your name."** 

Many of the people in today's gospel story lacked the imagination needed to understand what Jesus was about. They heard his words, but they were unable to see the faith that inspired them. The "voice from heaven" was simply thunder to some of them, but to others it was the voice of an angel.

The world is full of mystery and wonder for anyone who takes time to notice. Prayer in its simplest and purest form is just that, taking time to meditate on what is happening around us. Instead of asking God to change things, we should spend more time looking for the mystery and wonder in things as they are. When we are able to experience the presence of God in our everyday experiences, we can see miracles happening all the time and every "common bush" begins to blaze with the fire of the Holy Spirit.
