Palm Sunday Meditation

Every year 1000's of people make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Faithful Jews will weep as they touch the stones of the old temple. Devout Moslems long to pray in the place from which Mohammed rose to heaven. Reverent Christians will walk the route that Jesus walked on his way to the cross.

Among the crowd this weekend will be many history and heritage enthusiasts. Some of them are fascinated by the devotion of the faithful. Others will want to visit the sites they've read about in novels or seen in movies. Then there will be the curious who simply don't know what draws them to this centre of the world, but they come anyway. For many small businesses this will be one of the most profitable weeks this year. Not too different from the first Palm Sunday.

Religion, history and commerce will come together to make Jerusalem a beehive of activity. Worried about it all will be the Government of Israel. It will gladly encourage the commerce and collect the taxes, but it has strong political goals that must be protected. It also has a responsibility to keep the peace and protect the citizens. So there will be many secret police and armed soldiers.

Concerned as he was about the injustices of society, the words of Isaiah must have haunted him. "The Lord has anointed me... to bring good news to the oppressed... to proclaim the year of the Lord..." (61:1-2). Like Zechariah, he hoped for a new age of justice and peace. "Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding as a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey" (9:9). And he may have wept as he beheld the spiritual emptiness and sin of humanity. "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that

kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing" (Luke 13:34).

Here's a prayer exercise for you to do this week. Imagine yourself one of the people in the crowd as Jesus rode into Jerusalem. He looks towards you and his eyes lock onto yours. How do you feel? What thoughts run through your head? If this is a new type of prayer for you, don't spend any more than five minutes doing it. If you feel nothing that's okay. Try doing it again sometime later. Don't force yourself to feel anything special. Just let it be.
