#### Today's Short Message

Earth Day is celebrated worldwide each year on April 22<sup>nd</sup>. It marks the anniversary of the birth of the modern environmental movement that began in 1970. This year April 22<sup>nd</sup> falls on a Sunday.

Earth Day is noted on our Canadian Church Calendar and many biblical scholars and theologians have written books on this subject. It is number five of "The Five Marks of Mission" which have been an important guiding document of in the Anglican Communion for the last thirty years — "To strive to safeguard the integrity of and sustain and renew the life of the earth." Our Primate, The Most Revd Fred Hiltz, the National Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada; The Revd Susan C. Johnson, and our National Indigenous Bishop, The Rev. Mark MacDonald, in recognition of Earth Day 2018, have invited us "to join in praying for the humility and discipline to use Earth's resources wisely and responsibly."

An important part of every clergyperson's weekly schedule is preparing for Sunday services. For me the week usually begins with reflection on the lectionary readings for the following Sunday. Normally I accept without much question the appointed readings in the Common Lectionary which is used by many churches today. The lectionary theme for this Sunday is "The Good Shepherd." Unable to content myself with trying to match this theme with the call of the Primate, the leadership provided by the United Nations and other agencies throughout the world this week, I have made Earth Day concerns the theme of today's service. I hope you appreciate this and find some inspiration reflecting on the Bible passages and hymns being used today.

As I searched for appropriate hymns I came across #412 that was written by my good friend, The Rev. Canon Herbert O'Driscoll. Herb was born in Ireland and educated at Trinity College, Dublin. After his ordination in 1953 he practiced ministry for a short time in his homeland, but soon came to Canada where he served in several locations and has become one of the most highly regarded preachers in Canada and throughout the world.

Thinking of Herb as I chose his hymn for today, I decided to call him on Wednesday and was delighted to find him and his wife doing well in Victoria, BC. What a delight to connect by telephone with this mesmerizing storyteller and dynamic preacher. He was happy to hear from me, too, and sent me some of his newer hymns which have not been published. Among them is "God of This Great Creation." As we share in this service today let us pray "Make us and all things human one with creation's choir."
