Today's Varied Themes

Mother's Day: The second Sunday of May has been celebrated in society as Mother's Day for over a century. Most churches have for years had special activities to honour and celebrate motherhood on this Sunday. Let us give thanks for the special place that women play in our homes, community and the church. With thanksgiving for our mothers who have died, we give thanks for all that was great and pray that they rest in peace.

Jerusalem Sunday: At the 2013 Joint Assembly of the Anglican Church of Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church a resolution was passed to "observe the Seventh Sunday of Easter, commonly known as the Sunday after Ascension Day, as Jerusalem Sunday." The two churches jointly ask us to include the Jerusalem Church in our prayers today.

Ascension Day: Thursday was the 40th day after Easter, traditionally acknowledged as the day that Jesus ascended into heaven. The various manifestations of the resurrection of Christ among the disciples of Jesus in the Bible all appeared during the 40 days following Easter Day. Next Sunday (the fiftieth day after Easter Day) is the Day of Pentecost. Because Ash Wednesday was on February 14th this year, Holy Thursday was on May 10th, the Thursday before Mother's Day. The last time Ash Wednesday was on Valentine's Day was in 1945. Ash Wednesday will not fall on February 14th again until 2024?

On Children
