## Today's Short Message

"Fight the Good Fight." This has been the motto of the CLB since its beginning. The phrase itself is found the *First Letter to Timothy* (1:18 and 6:12) which has been traditionally ascribed to St. Paul. The items in the official logo are part of the Christian purpose as described in the *Letter to the Ephesians* (6:14-17).

St. Paul was born in Tarsus, an ancient city about 300 kilometres from Ephesus, in the country we call Turkey. At that time all the countries around the Mediterranean Sea were part of the Roman Empire. Although many people did not like being controlled by the Romans, the empire with its powerful army did maintain a long period of relative peace and built roads making it easy for people like St. Paul to travel to many countries. From his early life and throughout his missionary journeys, St. Paul would have seen many military parades and been in the company of soldiers.

The purpose of the CLB, then, is to help young people not simply to learn about the Christian way of life but to practice it. Truth, justice, peace and faith stand out like guideposts along that highway of life.

On behalf of the congregation of St. Peter's, I welcome the CLB and thank the officers who volunteer their time and concern for the welfare of our young people. Like many officers before them, the best thanks they can receive is seeing the fruit of their sacrifice being lived out in the lives of the girls and boys their corps.
