## **Theology That Matters**

Marcus Borg said, "The Christian life is about the opening of our hearts to God." A person with an open heart, he said, is "alive to wonder." S/he is simply excited about the fact that there is anything at all. But in order to communicate with one another we have to use language. Words and labels tend to tame our natural wonder so that we can communicate with others, but what the other person receives is always a little less than the real thing.

A person with an open heart responds with gratitude. S/he is glad to be alive. That is why we like to give gifts and write songs of praise to people and to God. **"Bless the Lord, all you works of the Lord; sing praise to him and highly exalt him forever."** (*From "The Benedicite"*)

An open heart feels the pain and suffering of the world. "The primary ethical imperative of the Christian life," he said, "is 'compassion." In Hebrew and Aramaic the word "compassion" is related to the word "womb." But this does not mean that compassion is a "wussy kind of virtue." Have you ever experienced the fierceness of an animal protecting her young from the enemy?

In the Bible compassion is also a political value. Compassion and passion for social justice go together because God cares about human suffering. As Marianne said, "God suffers in our suffering."

A lot of human suffering is natural and can be avoided only by paying careful attention to the laws of nature and respecting them. But, as Marcus said, the major source of human suffering in the Bible is brought about by the "social arrangements of society" that protect the interests of the rich and the strong. The message of the prophets, and of Jesus, is that God wants us to rearrange society with special emphasis on respecting the rights of the poor and the weak.
