Dear Parishioner:

I am very pleased to report to you on the affairs of our Parish for past few months. It has been my honour to serve as your Priest in Charge since September. A lot has happened in the past months and the Vestry is committed to being transparent and straight forward. The Parish is going to need to increase its income to meet its obligations for 2018.

Hopewell Gardens is part of a 50 acre piece of land that was bequeathed to St. Peter's by the late Jessie Cameron in 1975. Since that time 32 acres was sold to benefit our Parish for major maintenance and renovations. This year we have sold 10 acres and we hope to conclude the sale of the remaining eight acres as soon as some legal obstacles are dealt with in the coming months.

The Diocese has given direction to parishes that the proceeds from the sale of property is to be invested. The interest is then to be used for projects to support ministry rather than to cover operating expenses.

The enclosed financial report outlines how the proceeds from the land sold to date have been spent. This report was made at our most recent Vestry Meeting for the period ending November 30. A unique aspect of Parish

finances is that we normally receive the majority of our income in the last months of the year. We will need an increase in support in order to balance income to expenses. Expenses are on budget . Yet , if income remains at 2017 levels, we could see a deficit of about \$10,000.

One convenient way to support our Parish is to sign up for our automated giving program that would allow for a regular contribution to be deducted directly from your bank account. Many members enjoy this method of giving.

Our Parish is about much more than money. I am pleased to support a range of mission based activities that carry on at St. Peter's. Godly Play, Youth Choir, Senior Choir, The A.C.W., the Men's Service Club, the ministry to homes such as Admiral's Coast, the C.L.B., The Fellowship Band, our support to the Hopewell After School Program are examples of our ongoing activities that illustrate our commitment to serve.

I would like to extend a warm and sincere invitation to you, your family and your friends to come and enjoy the blessings of the Christmas Season with us. An outline of services and activities is attached.

We hope to see you, We thank God for every dollar received and for every minute of dedicated by our members. I would be very pleased to discuss any aspect of our financial affairs at your convenience. I can be reached at 744-2648.

St. Peter's Church Financial Update - November 30, 2018

To: Members of St. Peter's Church From: St. Peter's Vestry

At our Vestry Meeting on November 25th we decided that we should provide a special report at this time. A lot has happened this year. We appreciate your generous support, understanding and patience as we worked hard on your behalf.

Hopewell Gardens is part of the 50-acre piece of land generously bequeathed to St. Peter's by the late Jessie Cameron in 1975. In the past 30 or so years 32 acres were sold and the proceeds used to finance major maintenance and renovations of our church. At the Annual Meeting 2017 you authorised Vestry to sell the remaining 18 acres that we call Hopewell Gardens. We have a purchaser for the 18 acres and 10 acres has been sold and paid for. Unfortunately, there are some legal issues regarding the remaining 8 acres, but we are hopeful that the remaining 8-acre sale will be finalized early in 2019.We hope that with what you already know of our past financial and work history you will be able to make sense of the following concise report. Basically, with the 10-acre sale we have been able to pay off our major debts and still be able to have a substantial endowment that will bring income to our parish annually in future years. The Vestry has used what we used to call the Memorial Fund and part of the Cemetery Fund to help pay for the Special Projects listed below. New shingles on the roof is absolutely necessary. The lower level on the south side was completed this fall, but due to weather condition the remainder will not be done until next spring. The Diocese has approved paying for the roof project from the sale of Hopewell Gardens.

Now for our regular income/expense report and annual budget. Below is a concise summary of the income and expense to November 30^{th} . Although our expenses are in line with the annual budget, our income is below what was budgeted giving a November 30^{th} deficit of **\$21,876.71**. In past years, the December income has been much higher than other months and we expect this year will be the same. However, if our income for December this year is about the same as last year, we will still be \$10,000 short at the end of December. Vestry is hoping that our parishioners will respond with their customary generosity and give a little extra this year so that we can finish the year with a balanced financial report.
