First Reading

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF EXODUS

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great

sight, and see why the bush is not burned up." When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see. God called to him out of the bush. "Moses. Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. Then the Lord said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. God also said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'The Lord, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you': This is my name forever, and this my title for all generations." In anticipation of our Church re-opening next month, the Diocese has issued the following directive entitled "Church Attendance Rules."

CHURCH ATTENDANCE RULES

- Vulnerable persons (over the age of 60 or at risk due to an underlying medical condition), are at greater risk to their health and life if they contract COVID-19. If you are a vulnerable person, carefully consider if you should attend an in-person worship service.
- You MUST register prior to attendance and by so doing accept and agree to abide by these rules and other directions given to you by parish authorities.
- > Attendance is at your own risk.
- Maintain physical distancing of 6 feet or more with all outside your household.
- > Use hand sanitizers provided before taking your seat.
- Sit only in spaces designated by the parish
- Masks are mandatory except for those under the age of 5 and those with physical or mental conditions that prevent the wearing of a mask. Masks may be removed while you are seated or when receiving Communion.
- No singing.
- No physical touching with other attendees other than those in your household.
